Concert/Exhibition Band

- Made up of around 70 students, mostly freshmen
- Learn how to play and march (at the same time)
- Learn a marching show for performance at one football game and one competition
- Participate in home football games in pregame and pep band
- Participate in March-a-thon
- Participate in Millard Days parade
- Practice some Tuesday nights during the summer
- 9-12 All Band Camp is July 23-25
- Rehearse during 7th hour

Varsity Marching Band

- Made up of 192 students from all grade levels
- Hopefully know how to play and march at the same time
- Learn a marching show for performance at all home football games
- Participate in pregame and pep band during home football games
- Compete in 5 band competitions throughout the season
- One out of town competition (Minneapolis)
- Participate in March-a-thon and Millard Days parades
- Practice on Tuesday nights all summer and through the fall
- Percussion and Colorguard (rifles and sabres) also practice on Monday nights
- Color guard camps June 18-20 and July 21-25
- Percussion camp July 21-22
- 9-12 All band camp July 23-25
- Varsity band camp July 23-25 AND July 28-Aug 1
- Rehearse during 1st hour during school
- Also rehearse at 7:00am 3 days a week (usually Tuesday/Thursday/Friday)





ETM is a **Shared Contribution** that supports the band

- Includes the following costs:
 - Marching Show & Drill Design
 - Music / Props / Flags
 - Marching Staff & Guard Staff
 - MasterClass Instruction from Specialists
 - Travel Expenses (Buses, Hotel, Food, Trucks, Entry Fees)
 - Uniforms / Show Shirts / Polos / Shoes
 - Instrument Repair & Replace

- 60% of band expenses from ETM
- \$700/student for Varsity Band
- \$350/student for JV Band
 - Buses to OMI
 - No Minnesota Trip
 - Includes polos/shorts; instruction; instruments
- Part of Registration
 - Due June 30th AND can be made in 3 monthly installments

Uniform fittings

- All fittings are during band practice— 6pm-9pm
- Seniors- June 17th
- Juniors- July 1st
- Sophomores & Freshmen in Varsity- July 8th
- Freshmen
 July 22nd
- Make-Up Date- August 5th

- Students should wear athletic shorts and t-shirt for fittings
- Students will be fit for Marching uniform and summer uniform
 - For sophomores-seniors (previously in the band)
 – if they need new polo/shorts/drill masters
 – they can get those fitted as needed
 - Students should try on these items before coming to band practice that night- so they know if they need to be fit at that time
 - All Freshmen or New to band members will be fit for both
- We need lots of HELP for uniform fitting nights— Its easy and we teach each part of the uniform fitting- to make everyone comfortable with helping— no sewing or fitting experience needed

Drillmasters



- Drillmasters may be stored in the garment bag shoe pouch on the backside of the bag.
 - They should not be stored inside the bag with the uniform.
- Keep the shoe box
 - You can store the shoes in the box after Marching season is over
- Drillmasters should be cleaned prior to <u>each</u> performance.
 - Clean/polish with leather shoe polish (kiwi, weiman leather wipes)

Uniform information & Expectations While in Uniform

- Uniforms are expected to be well taken care of during Marching season and after.
 - Uniforms should be aired out after each performance- unzip the garment bag. Uniforms should <u>NEVER</u> be stored in a car/trunk, etc.
 - We usually ask for uniforms to be dry cleaned once during the fall this is at your own cost.
 Maxi-Walker is the only approved dry cleaner. I will send a notice when we determine its appropriate timing.
 - Uniforms are stored at home until uniform return date in May 2025.
- No Food or Drink (except water) while in full uniform
 - Football games
 - Students are NOT allowed to have anything but water until the 3rd quarterstudents are allowed to go to concessions at 3rd quarter
